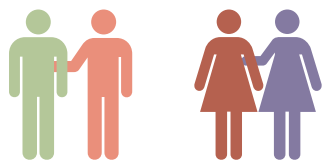

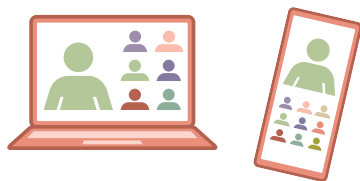

ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS AT A GLANCE

Over two million alcoholics have achieved sobriety in A.A., but members recognize that their program alone is not always effective with all alcoholics. Some members may also require professional counseling or medical treatment. Since we are recovering alcoholics, we have a special understanding of each other – we know what alcoholism feels like and learn from each other how to stay sober. A.A. is concerned solely with the personal recovery and continued sobriety of individual alcoholics. A.A. doesn't make medical diagnoses or keep records of members.

A.A. is not allied with any sect, denomination, politics, organization or institution; does not wish to engage in any controversy, neither endorses nor opposes any causes. Our primary purpose is to stay sober and help other alcoholics to achieve sobriety.

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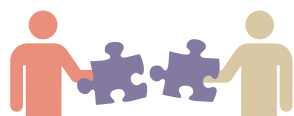
ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS MEMBERSHIP SURVEY 2022 BASEL



A.A. BASEL AS A RESOURCE FOR HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS

Professionals who work with alcoholics share a common purpose with A.A: to help the alcoholic stop drinking and stay sober.

People who think they have a drinking problem are welcome to attend any A.A. meeting. They can sit and listen and learn more about recovery, or they can share about themselves. It's completely up to them. Everyone is welcome. You don't have to pay anything to attend.



Professionals are welcome to observe open meetings to learn more about what happens in A.A. Members are available to meet virtually online, accompany you to an open in-person meeting and provide more information electronically or by post upon request.

PROFESSIONAL ASSISTANCE

BEFORE coming to A.A. **46%** of members received Health Care Professionals (HCP) services (medical, psychological, spiritual, etc). **42%** said HCP played an important role directing them to A.A.

AFTER coming to A.A. **36%** of members received HCP services. **42%** said HCP services play an important role in their recovery.

Basel fellowship has more than 30 members between 30 — 70 years old.

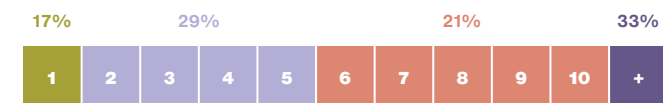
