Some members may also require professional counseling or medical treatment. A.A. is concerned solely with the personal recovery and continued sobriety of individual alcoholics. A.A. doesn't make medical diagnoses or keep records of members.

PROFESSIONAL ASSISTANCE

BEFORE coming to A.A. **65.9%** of members received Health Care Professionals (HCP) services (medical, psychological, spiritual, etc). **34.1%** said HCP played an important role directing them to A.A.

AFTER coming to A.A. **52.4%** of members received HCP services. **95%** said HCP services play an important role in their recovery.


